Kate Collins – Headteacher



Kate has enjoyed a varied teaching career working across many different settings; from 5 form entry junior schools to three form entry primary schools located in Tower Hamlets, Dorset and Surrey. Teaching from reception to year 6.

Maths has always been an area of specialism; attaining a Post Graduate Certificate in Mathematical Education from Brunel University, as well as being a lead maths teacher across Surrey, leading training in schools on both maths and assessment. Kate achieved her NPQH in 2014 and has used these leadership skills in her deputy headteacher role at Boxgrove Primary School and since February 2019, the headteacher of Sandfield Primary School.
