Years 1 and 2

This week Year 1 and Year 2 have continued learning about the Victorians. Year 2 enjoyed their trip to the Victorian Classroom and Toy Museum. They enjoyed dressing up in Victorian clothes and compared them with the clothes that they wear today. Year 1 and Year 2 have also been learning about the importance of Remembrance and made beautiful poppies.



Years 3 and 4

This week Year 3 and 4 have been learning about rocks and just what a journey they have been on! In our rock lab the children have been using scientific skills to observe different rocks and try to identify them based on their appearance and characteristics. They saw vinegar react with chalk and tested permeability and buoyancy. Great work rock investigators!



Years 5 and 6

We had a fantastic time at Henley Fort on Monday. Children were able to experience life as a Home Guard taking part in 'roadblocks' where they checked for enemy spies. Home Guard training was required for the role where children wore uniforms, learnt to march and experienced the daily activities that would have happened. Other activities included putting out fires and exploring the vital role of ARPs during the war. Children were shocked by the size of the Air Raid Shelters after squeezing into them and now have a much clearer understanding of how tough it would have been living through the war!
