# **David Maguire Visits Sandfield**

On Monday, 29<sup>th</sup> January, David Maguire visited Sandfield for the day. He is an educational technology consultant who is helping Sandfield ensure that our computing / technology offer is the best it can be. David started the day in a meeting with our technology ambassadors, Twalumba, Theo and Martha, who discussed our Sandfield Vision and the things we are doing in school to achieve that. <u>https://sandfield.surrey.sch.uk/school-ethos-vision-and-values/</u>

The children explained how the school is working towards achieving this in terms of the benefits of having a 1:1 device (one child – one iPad), the ability to personalise learning ensuring all children get what they need to make the best progress they can. They showed David the Apps they used regularly and projects they had completed using them, showcasing their learning across the curriculum. Finally, the ambassadors demonstrated how pupils use Seesaw every day. This platform allows teachers to send activities and support sheets to all pupils at their level and is also a vehicle to share their work and communicate with families.

David then taught three demonstration lessons in year 2, 4 and 6. He showed the children how to use green screen technology, which is an element of iMovie. In pairs children made short documentaries about toys, the rainforest and Matthew Henderson (North Pole explorer). The children and adults were amazed at how easy it was to use this App and how it can display their learning in a creative, unique way.

After school, David led a staff meeting, to show adults all the accessibility tools available on our iPads, which will enhance and support all children's learning. This was a highly successful training day for us, as Sandfield begins its journey to become an Apple Distinguished School.



Apple Distinguished Schools are centres of leadership and educational excellence that demonstrate a clear vision for learning with technology. These schools are some of the most innovative schools in the world. It will allow us to be part of a community which embraces and shares advances in educational technology. Currently there are 728 ADS schools in the world, spread across 36 countries and Sandfield wants to be part of that. 



### Years 1 and 2

Year 1 and 2 are continuing learning about The Great Fire of London, and in PE we recreated the events through dance. We enjoyed moving in different directions and creating different shapes with our bodies to show how the flames were spreading through London.

#### Years 3 and 4

We have been finishing off our food project this week. We have looked at the role of each animal in the food chain and then produced our food webs of the Amazonian animals. We learnt about producers, photosynthesis, predators and prey. Scarily, the anaconda can swallow a whole human and digest them over the course of weeks!





#### Years 5 and 6

In science, we investigated Darwin's theory of evolution where he stated that finches had evolved and adapted to their environment to survive. We explored which of the different beak types (chopsticks, tweezers, scissors and spoons) suited the varied diets of birds. After investigating, we found worms – strawberry laces! - were best suited to a long-pointed beak as they are often difficult to reach. Such a fun lesson...
