New Playground Update

We have received two quotes so far on replacing and levelling our playground, which we have shared with the Trust. We are in the process of liaising with companies to find the best price for this job. The PTA have kindly completed a grant application to support funding for the new playground and as a school we are in the process of finalising our project on the crowd funding platform, Space Hive. As soon as this is live, we will share the link with you.

Mrs Howard has been working with our JLT to think of ideas for the new playground – a zip wire between the two buildings has been suggested, as well as playground games painted on the new surface. The JLT will be working with their classes to think of a sponsored activity that the whole school can do using the Paris Olympics as inspiration.

As soon as I have the final target figure for the construction work, we will set up a fundraising thermometer, which will measure our progress to reach our target. The new playground will be such a positive for our school, enabling all children to have high quality PE teaching on site, as well as a larger, safer place to play.



Holiday Camps at Sandfield – an Explanation

As a school we have worked closely with Planet Soccer to offer both wrap around care and holiday camps. We appreciate that good quality childcare is very important for working families and we try our best to offer this. Planet Soccer is a business that can only function if there is a specific level of income generated. They have staff to pay, resources to buy, cleaning and rent costs to cover.

Planet Soccer are only able to run a holiday camp at Sandfield in the main holidays due to access of HAF funding to support it. HAF funding stands for Holiday Activities and Food Programme.
