#### **NEWS FROM THE CLASSROOMS**

## **Reception Class**

We have gone mad for number bonds this week!

The children explored the composition for numbers to 10. Using Numicon and part-whole models, we systematically figured out the number bonds to 10. Some children went beyond to experiment with ways to make 10 with three parts, using a three-part part-whole model to show their learning. They also discovered that if they found ways to make 10 groups of 10s with Nnumicon, they made the number 100!





## Year 1 and 2

In DT this term, we have been designing Tudor houses using different materials. We have created 3D Tudor houses from recycled materials. The children have also designed and created clay reliefs of Tudor houses. Next week we are going to finish our project by painting and varnishing them, before we take them home.





## Year 3 and 4

We have been using the amazing film 'The Jungle Cruise' as our writing stimulus for this half term. The film is based on the adventures of 3 explorers as they navigate up the Amazon river in search of a sacred tree. The writing from the children has been really amazing and they have been watching clips to get a full flavour of the story for their writing.



#### Year 5 and 6

In Geography, we have been exploring possible ways to 'slow down' global warming. This week, we investigated renewable energy. In groups they researched different types of renewable energy and presented their work in the style of a Newsround report. All groups showed maturity, collaboration skills and brilliant methods of communication too.
