


#### **NEWS FROM THE CLASSROOMS**

## **Reception Class**

In Reception this week, we travelled back to the land before time, when dinosaurs roamed our planet! We learnt about different species of dinosaurs and used previously learnt scientific vocabulary to describe what they ate. The children were introduced to the process of fossilisation, made their own fossils out of salt dough and investigated the most effective ways to melt ice to free the dinosaurs from their ice eggs!







#### Year 1 and Year 2

In our Geography lessons this week Year 1 and 2 have been learning all about Peruvian foods. We watched some videos that showed us different Peruvian markets. We were fascinated to learn that they have over 3000 different types of potatoes and that they also have purple corn! The children enjoyed creating a fact file about their favourite foods.

#### Year 3 and Year 4

Year 3 and Year 4 have been finding out about the pyramids of Ancient Egypt and what they were built for. It turns out there are 4 different designs. The pyramid of Giza was built using 2300000 limestone bricks and it was 139m tall. The pyramids were used for burying Pharaohs and storing their treasures for the afterlife. The pyramids were normally located to the West of the Nile and in sunny spots. The skilled Egyptians would use pulleys and sledges to transport the bricks to the west of the Nile.





#### Year 5 and Year 6

We have started a new DT project where we will be sewing little felt toys based on pictures from KS1. There are all sorts of lovely designs including footballs, princesses, teddies and dolphins! So far, we have carefully planned, chosen the correct felt colours and cut out patterns to use as templates. Some of us have even started sewing. We really hope Year 1 and 2 are happy when we present them with the finished products.
