MESSAGE FROM MRS COLLINS

Sandfield Playground Project

Breaking news! We have secured capital funding from the Learning Partners Trust for our new playground. As you can imagine, planning and constructing a new playground is a significant investment. Our primary goal is to level the playground and build a retaining wall alongside the trim trail near the KS2 building.

We plan to install a special soft-pour surface made from rubber granules. This surface is designed to absorb impacts and ensure safety by protecting against falls. Additionally, new lines and games will be painted onto the surface, and we will invest in new seating areas.

The total cost of the project is estimated to be around £140,000. Half of the funds will come from the Trust, with an additional £10,000 contributed by the PTA. The remaining amount will be covered by our school reserves. We are currently in the process of seeking planning permission and finalising quotes, with the aim of completing this major construction project over the summer holidays. This is an exciting time at Sandfield, as we look forward to providing a fantastic new resource for all our children.

Year 1 & Year 2


